

These ethical wills customarily contain lessons learned, esteemed ideas, expressions of gratitude, hope, advice, and stories from the past. While typically written shortly before one is on their deathbed, I thought it would be a cool thing to do for this Echo – for there is so much we all share from our camp experience. We can pass what we have learned over the years down to future generations. So, here is my ethical will to all of you and to those who examine these words years from now.

The Lessons and Values I Have Learned:

- Hinei ma tov learning to live together in peace and harmony.
- Noblesse Oblige making a difference in the life of others by sharing your strengths sharing your talents or your wealth so others can benefit. In 1937, Elias A. Cohen wrote, "May Noblesse Oblige always be your motto and may each of you strive ever to lift the banner of Tranquillity higher and higher so that each of us shall be respected and loved by all of those with whom we come in contact, but also, and most important of all, that we so live that we may always be able to respect ourselves."
- Don't be a *schlemiel*, as Pearl C. Miller used to say put your best effort into everything you do continuously attempt your best no matter how hard it may seem. Speaking of not giving up, the sonnet "Somebody Said it Couldn't Be Done," by Edgar Albert Guest comes to mind. I distinctly remember Pearl reciting it multiple times over the years I was fortunate to share with her.
- Be charitable continuously give your time and/or money to worthy causes no amount is too little, and all donations are graciously appreciated.
- Perform deeds of benevolence. The secret to happiness and fulfillment is doing honorable deeds for others. There is no greater fulfillment than being able to assist another person.
- Always be genuine and honest, for as the saying goes, "it is the best policy". Being consistently genuine and honest will affect your future dealings with others, as they will have less respect and trust in you if you are not upstanding with them.
- Be grateful for each day do not take things for granted. We are all thankful for Tranquillity Camp, and that means never taking it for granted. Do what you can to ensure its future.
- It is essential to attend events, donate time and money to support your favored charities of course, Tranquillity Camp is my favorite charity, and with any luck it is yours too. I look forward to seeing you at our next event honoring Richard Lerner (with whom I have had the pleasure of working for 24 years) and the 100th Birthday celebration of Tranquillity Camp).

I am honored to know so many of you reading this page – you cannot imagine how you fill my life and help honor my commitment to perpetuating the good name of Elias A. Cohen and Tranquillity Camp. Always know, each of you forever holds a special place in my heart. I am optimistic that when our time comes to go to the heavens above, the inspiration of what we learned in camp, our wonderful memories, and the bonds of friendships we created and held onto will live on forever. I hope we all will pass down those lessons and values to future generations and do what we can to keep Tranquillity Camp going for at least another 100 years. To those reading these words many years from the Fall of 2019, I hope your brilliant life finds motivation and inspiration from those who came before you, knowing so many Tranquillity-ites are standing by your side. When you need it most, if you see a butterfly, think of it as me, watching over you, your family, and your friends.

Of course, my ethical will has a good deal more to say and stories to tell; however, the above-listed items are closest to my heart. Wishing you all the best in life. May your lives, your families, and your friends forever find faith, love, and tranquility, so that it fills your heart with happiness.


